TRAINER'S BONUS

The trainer of the horse accruing the highest number of points in the series will receive \$1,000.

Should the winning horse be trained by two or more trainers during the series the bonus will be shared equally between such trainers.

OWNER'S BONUS

The owner/s of the horse which has the most starts in the series will receive \$1,000.

If number of starts is equal at the end of the series a countback will take place. The horse with the most wins in the series will be declared the winner,

Series Starting Points:

- Horse having first start in the series - 1pt
- horse having second start in the series - a further point
- horse having third start in the series - a further 2pts
- horse having fourth start in the series - a further 2pts
- horse having fifth start in the series - a further 2pts
- horse having sixth start in the series - a further 2pts
- horse having seventh start in the series - a further 2pts

Points for each race in the series:

- First - 10pts
- Second - 5pts
- Third - 3pts
- Fourth - 2pts

POINTS & CONDITIONS

Horses receive two lots of points (i.e. series starting points as well as placing points).

The highest aggregate point score at the end of the series wins the bonus.

If point score is equal at the end of the series a count back will take place. The horse with the most wins in the series will be declared the winner, failing that, the horse with the most second placings, etc.

TRAINERS

DOES YOUR WORKPLACE HAVE THE NECESSARY INJURY INSURANCE PROTECTION?

Following news that several local trainers sustained serious injury recently whilst carrying on their training activities, it is perhaps timely to remind trainers of their legal obligations, and the various other insurance options that are available, to protect their workers, family members who work in their business and of course, the Trainers themselves.

Worker's Compensation - your Legal Responsibility

It is a prescribed responsibility i.e.: embodied in legislation, in the Northern Territory that every business that employs or hires Workers on a full-time, part-time or casual basis, under an oral or written contract of service or apprenticeship, must effect worker's compensation insurance with a local, licensed insurer.

Definition of a Worker

For the purposes of this insurance, a Worker is:

- a natural person who performs work or a service of any kind for another person under a contract, receives remuneration and is, in relation to the contract, an employee for the purpose of assessment for PAYG withholding under the 'Taxation Administration Act 1953 (Cth)', Schedule 1, Parts 2-5, even if the employer is not withholding tax when they should be. Workers who typically fall into this category for a Trainer include stable hands, foremen & track riders.
- this definition does not extend to individuals who provide a service using their own tools of trade, and rectify any defects at their own expense. Veterinarians and farriers are common examples of independent contractors who fall into this category

An on-line tool is available on the ATO website to assist Trainers to determine if their Worker/s fit within the definition. If the business engages and pays Workers, it is recommended you visit www.ato.gov.au/Calculators-and-tools/Employee-or-contractor/

Certain Workers Covered Under Specific Circumstances

- Trainers can qualify for inclusion under a worker's compensation policy in limited circumstances only. If the **Trainer is a director of a registered training business**, he or she can be covered if the company has taken out a worker's compensation policy, and both personal details and the remuneration of the Trainer have been disclosed to the insurer.
- If the training business is owned by an individual, or is a partnership (therefore, is not a registered company), family members who live with the owner/s of the training business and who are paid to assist with training activities, can also be covered if both their personal details & remuneration have been disclosed to the insurer.

Racing & Betting Act 1983 (as amended)

This Act requires TRNT to effect worker's compensation insurance for **licensed jockeys, track work riders, stable hands and foremen**, whilst any of these individuals are:

- actively engaged in thoroughbred racing and training activities; and
- are doing so on any licensed premises and/or within the associated environs e.g.: environs includes float and car parks attaching to the premises, roadways connecting to stables, the dry riverbed of the Todd River which sits adjacent the Pioneer Park training centre, etc.

In effect, the Act compels TRNT to treat these individuals as their very own "deemed" workers whilst they are working on a licensed premises. Of note, is the Act **does not** extend this "deeming" provision to include licensed Trainers – hence, TRNT cannot expand their policy to cover Trainers, as the legislation does not allow them to do so at this time.

Given the above, Trainers should consider the following:

Firstly, all Trainers have a legal obligation to effect worker's compensation insurance to cover Workers they engage and pay a wage, for activities related to their training business. There will be instances where the TRNT insurance will be the 'host policy' for a Trainer's injured worker. Equally, there will be instances where a **workplace injury will not occur at a licensed premises or within the associated environs**, and therefore, the TRNT insurance will not apply. For example, injury whilst unloading a horse at an agistment property, during a rehoming exercise, or whilst at a veterinary clinic. Similarly, whilst riding the horse for training purposes in bushland or trails, or during beach work anywhere in Darwin. To cover this worker related risk, all Trainers **MUST** effect their own worker's compensation insurance. If Trainers do not already have a policy, please contact NT Worksafe on 1800 250 713 for assistance.

Secondly, if Trainers cannot access personal protection under a worker's compensation policy (refer to **Certain Workers Covered Under Specific Circumstances**), they should examine alternative insurance options. As shown recently, accidents do occur, and the costs of medical care and any associated downtime can be a considerable burden for a Trainer to absorb. Accordingly, Trainers are encouraged to explore Personal Accident & Illness, Trauma and Life insurance, all insurances commonly held by many self-employed individuals across the racing industry, and indeed, in many other vocations outside of racing.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING NT RACE MEETINGS

(unless otherwise noted)

NOMINATIONS will close at 9.30am on the Monday prior to the race meeting.

WEIGHTS will be declared on the following day (Tuesday) at 1.00pm.

ACCEPTANCES will be at 9.30am on the Wednesday prior to the race meeting.

RIDER DECLARATION will be at 12 noon on the Wednesday prior to the race meeting.

NOMINATIONS

NTLR48. The Principal Racing Authority reserves the right to;

(a) Transfer the nomination of any horse entered for a race which is or may be deleted from a program. Such transfer must occur prior to the declaration of weights.

(b) Transfer the nomination of any horse that is declared ineligible by the handicapper at the time for nominations. Such transfer must occur prior to the declaration of weights.

(c) Transfer the nomination of any horse that becomes ineligible after entry closing and prior to declaration of acceptances for that race.

Provided that where such horse has not been scratched from the race concerned at the time for acceptance, the acceptance of the horse transferred shall be taken as the nominator's approval of such transfer.

NTLR49: Where there are eight (8) or fewer nominations at the time set down for close of entries, the Club may extend the time for entries until 9.30 am the following day or such other time as determined by the Club.

(Provided that any horse which is an extended nomination will be placed in the order of ballot so as to be balloted prior to any horse which is not).

LATE NOMINATIONS

Late nominations will be accepted for race meetings conducted within the Northern Territory under the following conditions:

(i) such nominations will only be accepted prior to 9.30am on the day following the advertised closing of nominations or such other time as determined by the club.

(ii) late nominations will incur a fee equal to the nomination fee plus two per cent (2%) of the advertised prize money of the race plus GST.



SCRATCHING

NTLR109. Notwithstanding the provision of AR181 no horse shall be withdrawn from any race after the time prescribed for acceptances without the permission of the Stewards.

No withdrawal shall be permitted after 8.00 am on the day of a race for any meeting except at the direction of the Stewards.

(1) Withdrawals will be liable for the riding fee as set out in NTLR75. Also they may be liable for the following fees, unless a veterinary certificate satisfactory to the stewards is produced;

(i) TAB meeting \$100

(ii) NON-TAB meeting \$50

Or the acceptance fee, whichever is the greater.

(2) Provided that at all meetings covered by TAB the following shall apply:

(a) no withdrawal will be permitted from a race with 6 or less acceptances except with a veterinary certificate acceptable to the stewards.

(b) trainers must notify the stewards as soon as practicable after an injury/lameness/disability which may require an acceptor to be scratched, comes or should have come to their notice (if not a scratching fee of \$500 will be imposed).

(c) if a trainer accepts for a horse which is subsequently scratched and in the opinion of the stewards the trainer knew or should have known at acceptance time that the horse was unlikely to start, a scratching fee of \$500 will be imposed.

ACCEPTANCES

NTLR32 All declaration of acceptances shall be made by the nominator, trainer or by the authorised agent of either of them in such form or by such means and shall be done by such time as prescribed by the TRNT.

NTLR33 If there are fewer than five (5) acceptors for a race, the prescribed closing time for the declaration of acceptances may be extended by thirty (30) minutes.

NTLR36 (a) No horse shall remain in the field at the time set down for acceptances for more than one race on any day except in the case of an emergency acceptor, which may remain in the field for another race provided that no other horse is balloted out due to it remaining in more than one race.

(b) The provisions of part (a) of this rule shall not apply to acceptors that are declared an emergency in the following races:

Darwin (Carnival): Darwin Guineas, Chief Minister's Cup, Toyota Cup, NT Derby, Metric Mile, Darwin Corporate Park Cup, Palmerston Sprint, Darwin Cup.

Darwin (non-Carnival): St Patrick's Day Cup.

Alice Springs (Carnival): Alice Springs Guineas, Chief Minister's Cup, Pioneer Sprint, Alice Springs Cup.

VETERINARY NOTICES

AR 257 Therapeutic substances

(1) For analysis of a therapeutic substance in a sample taken at any time from a horse, there must be an initial screening test or screening analysis of the sample.

(2) As a minimum requirement, the initial screening test or screening analysis must be conducted by an Official Racing Laboratory in accordance with the following procedure:

(a) the relevant biological matrix, equivalent in volume to the portion or aliquot of the sample being tested, is to have added to it a quantity of the therapeutic substance or its specified metabolite, sufficient to bring its concentration to the screening limit specified for that therapeutic substance – this is known as the “spiked sample” and is to be analysed concurrently with the sample;

(b) the portion or aliquot of the sample is then to be tested to determine whether or not it contains a quantity of the therapeutic substance or its specified metabolite that exceeds that screening limit, by making a direct comparison with the spiked sample;

(c) if the screening limit is not exceeded, the detection of the therapeutic substance in the sample is not to be reported on a Certificate of Analysis;

(d) if the screening limit is exceeded, then the sample is to be further tested in accordance with normal laboratory procedures designed to certify the presence of the therapeutic substance in the sample.

(3) A therapeutic substance for the purpose of this rule and the screening limit applicable to it or its specified metabolite is to be promulgated and published from time to time by Racing Australia.

(4) The screening limit testing provided for in this rule is not intended to and does not operate to mean that for the purpose of the Rules the relevant therapeutic substance only becomes a prohibited substance if and when the screening limit is exceeded.

(5) It is no defence to an alleged breach of AR 240 or AR 241 that the result of any initial screening test or screening analysis should have been below the screening limit for the therapeutic substance in question

Screening Limits for Therapeutic Substances

For the purpose of AR.257, it is hereby notified that screening limits applicable to the following therapeutic substances, as approved by the Australian Racing Board, are set out as follows:

acepromazine – 0.02 nanograms per millilitre (ng/mL) in plasma

acepromazine – 10ng/mL of the 2-(1-hydroxyethyl) promazine sulphoxide metabolite in urine

betamethasone – 0.20ng/mL in urine

butorphanol – 0.01ng/mL in plasma

butorphanol – 1ng/mL in urine

carprofen – 100ng/mL in plasma

carprofen – 100ng/mL in urine

dantrolene – 1ng/mL of the 5-hydroxydantrolene metabolite in unhydrolysed urine

detomidine – 0.02ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxydetomidine metabolite in plasma

detomidine – 2ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxydetomidine metabolite in urine

dexamethasone – 0.2ng/mL in urine

diclofenac – 50ng/mL in urine

dipyrrone – 1000ng/mL of the 4 methylaminoantipyrine metabolite in urine

eltenac – 50ng/mL in urine

flunixin – 1ng/mL in plasma

flunixin – 100ng/mL in urine

frusemide – 0.1ng/mL in plasma

frusemide – 50ng/mL in urine

hyoscinebutylbromide

(or n-butylscopolammonium) – 0.05ng/mL in plasma

hyoscine butylbromide

(or n-butylscopolammonium) – 25ng/mL in urine

ipratropium – 0.25ng/mL in urine

ketoprofen – 100ng/mL in urine

lignocaine – 0.05ng/mL in plasma

lignocaine – 10ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxylignocaine metabolite in urine

meclofenamic acid – 5ng/mL in plasma

meclofenamic acid – 250ng/mL in urine

medetomidine – 0.02ng/mL of 3' hydroxymedetomidine in plasma

medetomidine – 5ng/mL of 3'-hydroxymedetomidine in urine

meloxicam – 1ng/mL in plasma

meloxicam – 10ng/mL in urine

mepivacaine – 0.05ng/mL in plasma

mepivacaine – 10ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxymepivacaine metabolite in urine

methocarbamol – 100ng/mL in urine (when restricted to a single oral or IV treatment of no more than 5 grams of methocarbamol) 2

naproxen – 250ng/mL in urine

phenylbutazone – 100ng/mL in plasma

phenylbutazone – 100ng/mL in urine

romifidine – 1ng/mL in urine

salbutamol – 0.5ng/mL in urine

triamcinolone acetonide – 0.5ng/mL in urine

vedaprofen – 50ng/mL in urine”

AR 2 Dictionary (definition of “qualified veterinary surgeon”)

The term “qualified veterinary surgeon” is currently used in AR 34(3) (regarding horse registration) and AR 225 (regarding euthanasia).

From 1 January 2020 the term will also be used in new/amended rules which provide that:

- only a qualified veterinary surgeon can perform shockwave therapy on a horse – AR 86(4);
- only a qualified veterinary surgeon can perform endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse – AR 231(6); and
- a defence to blood doping offences exists where certain therapy is provided by a qualified veterinary surgeon – AR 257A.

The term is being defined in the Rules to provide clarity as to what constitutes a qualified veterinary surgeon.

In addition to having the relevant qualifications, the definition includes an additional requirement that the veterinarian be approved by the relevant PRA if required, given such a requirement applies under the Racing NSW Local Rules.

Amend AR 2 as follows:

AR 2 Dictionary

In the interpretation of these Australian Rules (and any race meeting held under them), unless the context requires otherwise, the words and phrases below have the meanings set out in this rule.

“qualified veterinary surgeon means a veterinarian who is:

- (a) registered with the Veterinary Practitioners Board (or equivalent regulatory body) in a State or Territory of Australia; and
- (b) approved by the relevant PRA (including by way of permit, approval or licence) if required by a Local Rule of that PRA.”

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 86 Shockwave therapy

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) advises:

- there is increasing evidence of the use of shockwave therapy by lay people and that this treatment is not being reported as required under the Rules of Racing; and
- there are increased risks of tissue injury in horses that are subject to shockwave therapy performed by untrained lay people.

Accordingly, VAC has recommended that the Rules are amended to restrict the performance of shockwave therapy to qualified veterinarians only.

This position is supported by the Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee.

Further, VAC has noted that Equine Veterinarians Australia does not support shockwave therapy performed by lay people.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of new subrule (4).

Amend AR 86 as follows:

“AR 86 Horses that have had shockwave therapy

(4) A person must not perform shockwave therapy on a horse unless he or she is a qualified veterinary surgeon.”

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 87 Intra-articular injections

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) notes there is significant anecdotal evidence of the increasing use of anti-inflammatory and pain relieving medications – as an alternative to corticosteroids – being given by intra-articular (IA) injection, such as the opioid morphine or the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) ketorolac (Toradol), and IA desensitising substances such as ammonium sulphate (Nuromene) and polyacrylamide hydrogel which may have a neurotoxic mechanism of action.

VAC has expressed concern that the use of IA opioids and NSAIDs close to racing would promote significant analgesia (pain numbing effect) and compromise the welfare of the horse, and the safety of the rider, in at least the same way as a corticosteroid IA injection close to racing would. Substances such as P-block which have come to attention at recent inquiries are unregistered injections and as such should not be held by trainers under AR 252.

Accordingly, VAC has recommended that AR 87 be expanded to prohibit the IA administration of any substance at any time during the 8 clear days prior to a race, official trial or jump-out. The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee supports VAC's recommendation.

Racing Australia has approved the amendments to AR 87 as set out below.

Amend AR 87 as follows:

“AR 87 Horses that have had an intra-articular injection

- (1) If a horse has been subjected to an intra-articular injection:
 - (a) the horse is ineligible for; and
 - (b) a trainer must not enter or start the horse in, any race, official trial, or jump-out for 8 clear days following midnight on the day of the administration.
- (2) If a horse has been subjected to, or the Stewards reasonably suspect a horse has been subjected to, an intra-articular injection at any time during the 8 clear days prior to the day of a race, official trial, or jump-out, the Stewards may order the scratching of the horse from the relevant event.
- (3) If a horse has been nominated and/or entered for a race, official trial, or jump-out, a person must not:
 - (a) administer;
 - (b) cause to be administered;
 - (c) attempt to administer; or
 - (d) be party to the administration of, an intra-articular injection to the horse at any time within 8 clear days of the race, official trial, or jump-out.

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 143 Apprentices' winning rides book

Racing Australia is amending AR 143 to accord with the current practice of apprentice jockeys being required to provide their winning rides book to a Steward before weighing-out in a race.

Amend AR 143 as follows:

AR 143 Weight allowances for apprentice jockeys

- “(12)(a) A winning rides book must be issued to every apprentice jockey by a PRA.
- (b) It is the responsibility of the apprentice jockey and the apprentice jockey's master to ensure that the apprentice jockey brings the winning rides book to each race meeting the apprentice jockey participates at and that winning rides are entered in that winning rides book and endorsed by a Steward before the apprentice jockey leaves the racecourse.
- (c) An apprentice jockey must provide his or her winning rides book to a Steward before weighing-out in any race.”

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 231 Endoscopy of the respiratory tract

Racing Australia is amending AR 143 to accord with the current The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) advises there is increasing evidence of training establishments performing endoscopy of the respiratory tract without any veterinary involvement. Endoscopy is an invasive procedure with risks to horses and human handlers.

The act of introducing an endoscope into the respiratory tract is not itself considered an act of veterinary science within the relevant legislation where it is performed by a lay person on a horse in their care and without a fee for service being charged. However lay persons performing this procedure are by virtue of the action then accordingly making a diagnosis – which is considered an act of veterinary science – and, further, instigating some form of drug therapy as a result of that lay diagnosis (often without any veterinary consultation).

Accordingly, VAC is of the view that endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse should only be performed by a qualified veterinarian. The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee supports this position.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of new subrule (6).

Amend AR 231 as follows:

AR 231 Care and welfare of horses

“(6) A person must not perform endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse unless he or she is a qualified veterinary surgeon.”

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 257A Blood doping

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) has recommended that a new rule is introduced to mitigate the manipulation of normal blood parameters by infusing stored blood or blood products (commonly referred to as 'blood doping' in human sports).

This is because blood doping may be used to illegally increase the oxygen-carrying capacity of the blood. Accordingly, it represents a threat to both equine welfare and racing integrity.

The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee is of the view that a prohibition on blood doping should be introduced into the Rules of Racing in accordance with VAC's recommendation. Racing Australia has approved the addition of a new rule as set out below. Note the rule contains a defence in subrule (3) to any charge where blood doping was conducted for life-saving purposes and/or as part of certain veterinary regenerative treatment.

Insert new AR 257A as follows:**"AR 257A Prohibition on blood doping**

(1) A person must not:

- (a) withdraw and re-infuse; or
- (b) withdraw, manipulate and re-infuse, homologous, heterologous, or autologous blood, blood products or blood cells into the circulatory system of a horse.

(2) A person must not administer any quantity of homologous, heterologous, or autologous blood, blood products or blood cells of any origin into the circulatory system of a horse.

(3) Notwithstanding subrules (1) and (2), a PRA or the Stewards may find that it is a complete defence to a charge laid under subrule (1) or (2) if in their opinion:

- (a) the relevant conduct was for life-saving purposes; and/or
- (b) the relevant conduct was part of a veterinary regenerative therapy for the treatment of musculoskeletal injury or disease administered by or under the supervision of a qualified veterinary surgeon."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 270A Breach of suspension restrictions

When licensed or registered persons are suspended, they are subject to certain express restrictions under the Rules of Racing and may also be subject to other conditions imposed by the relevant PRA or Stewards.

In contrast to the rules regarding disqualifications (AR 263(4)) – which expressly provide that a breach of any restriction while disqualified results in an automatic recommencement of the disqualification and possible further penalty (subject to PRA discretion) – the rules regarding suspensions do not specify the consequence of a breach of any restriction while suspended.

The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee is of the view that a new rule should be introduced for breaching suspension restrictions while suspended, which is consistent with the rule in respect of disqualified persons. This will add a further deterrent for suspended persons who may be inclined to contravene the conditions of their suspension.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of a new rule as set out below.

Insert new AR 270A as follows:**"AR 270A Penalty for breach of terms of suspension**

(1) Except with the consent of the PRA or the Stewards in whose territory a suspension was imposed, a suspended person must not during the period of the suspension contravene any of the Rules in respect of, or the terms or conditions of, the suspension.

(2) Unless otherwise determined by the PRA or the Stewards in whose territory a suspension was imposed or adopted, if a person breaches subrule (1), the period of suspension imposed on that person must automatically restart from the most recent date of the breach, and the person may also be subject to further penalty.

(3) The provisions of subrules (1) and (2) apply to any suspended person, regardless of when the suspension was imposed."

AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING
COBALT RULES
CONSIDERED & REAFFIRMED

Racing Australia's Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) recently completed a review of matters raised in relation to Cobalt and provided the Board of Racing Australia with its expert advice on the matter.

The Board also considered that the view among international racing authorities continues to be consistent with Racing Australia that cobalt has the potential to positively affect performance and is a welfare risk at toxic levels and that Rules of Racing are required to protect against this risk.

In light of VAC's advice, the Board of Racing Australia reaffirmed its position in respect of cobalt and advises that it does not propose to make any amendments to the Australian Rules of Racing.

In summary the VAC report advised the following:

- there remains a view among international racing authorities that cobalt has the potential to positively affect performance and is a welfare risk at toxic levels;
- a typical daily diet of a racehorse meets a horse's cobalt requirement and there have been no reported cases of cobalt deficiency in horses;
- there is no nutritional, medical or welfare justification for the administration of cobalt salts by injection at any time;
- at doses higher than the nutritional requirements for B12 production, cobalt has been demonstrated to stimulate erythropoiesis (red blood cell production) in mammals by a mechanism completely separate and different from that of the production of B12;
- in addition to stimulating erythropoietin (EPO) production, by means of stabilising HIF, cobalt can induce the expression of more than 200 genes – some of the HIF-activated genes encode proteins that may increase physical performance (e.g. energy metabolism); and
- in the period 1 September 2016 (when the revised 100 ug/L threshold was introduced) to September 2019, 42,477 urine tests nationally have produced an average result of 5.1ug/L and only 59 positive samples (0.14%).

SUGGESTED PRACTICE WHEN PURCHASING TRIED HORSES FROM INTERSTATE

When buying tried horses from interstate, it is recommended that owners/trainers should ensure that they are fully aware of their purchase's NT rating BEFORE the purchase is finalized:

1. Contact the Integrity Department to request an NT rating for the horse in question. Allow yourself ample time in which to receive a response.
2. The Integrity Department will then make this request of the handicapper on your behalf.
3. The handicapper will respond with an NT rating in writing, which will be passed onto the owner/trainer who has requested it.
PLEASE DO NOT contact the handicapper directly.
4. As a general guide for owners/trainers wishing to purchase a horse from interstate, the handicapper has advised the following:
 - a. When obtaining a horse from Victoria or South Australia, the NT rating will be similar to its current rating (within 2-3 points);
 - b. When obtaining a horse from country Queensland, be aware that the rating in the NT will be slightly lower than the southern State ratings;
 - c. When obtaining a horse from country New South Wales, ignore the rating completely. Country NSW ratings work off a different scale and horses require re-rating when coming to the Territory;
 - d. Metropolitan and Provincial New South Wales ratings will receive similar treatment to those in Victoria and South Australia.
5. This general guide is not intended to be a substitute for the enquiry at 1 above, which is the only satisfactory way of checking a particular horse's NT rating.
6. Thoroughbred Racing NT will not accept any responsibility if incorrect ratings information is obtained from the handicapper whether through this process or by other means.

RACEDAY SWABBING PROCEDURES

Trainers are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that they and/or any person who represents them during the swabbing of their horses, are fully aware of the raceday swabbing procedure and that they observe all stages of that procedure.

The Club's veterinary surgeon and/or swabbing attendant will ensure that persons who are unfamiliar with the procedure have it explained to them and also inform them that as the trainer's representative, they should observe all stages of the swabbing procedure.

Trainers are reminded that the onus is on the trainer or his/her representative to observe the procedure.

ELECTIVE TESTING OF NON RACEDAY SAMPLES

Trainers are advised that they are now able to have non-raceday samples screened by the Australian Raceday Forensic Laboratory on request for certain long-acting therapeutic substances.

This service has been introduced to assist trainers to determine the suitability for racing of horses under their care that have been treated with these long acting medications.

The special non-raceday drug screens are confined to corticosteroids, anabolic steroids or procaine (arising from the administration of procaine penicillin). To use this service, trainers must first gain approval from the Stewards, who will then supply the appropriate collection kits, seals and documentation.

Samples must be collected in accordance with the Australian Racing Forensic Laboratory collection procedures and must be accompanied by a Testing of Special Non-Raceday Samples application. Samples will not be tested unless they are packaged and sealed properly and accompanied by the appropriate documentation.

Trainers are warned that the results of any non-raceday testing do not absolve them of their responsibilities in the event of a positive result arising from samples taken at any registered race meeting. Further details in relation to lodging of samples can be obtained from Stewards at Darwin Turf Club or Alice Springs Turf Club.

REGISTER OF DISQUALIFICATION, WARNING OFF & FORFEIT

So long as any person is on the Forfeit List, he is subject to the same disabilities and penalties as are declared by AR278 to apply to persons who are disqualified. So long as any horse is on the Forfeit List, such horse shall not be entered in or run for any race, or be trained upon any course where these Rules are in force

TRAINERS & OWNERS REMINDER

STABLE RETURNS

Trainers are reminded of their obligations in regards to stable returns. As per **AR103** as a trainer you are responsible for completing a stable return for all horse **immediately** upon entering or leaving the stable -this includes when a horse is sent for a spell for traceability purposes you must notify as to where the horse is to be located.

TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

Please remember that a transfer of ownership must be lodged and paid for to Racing Australia prior to the horse being nominated. Once the transfer has been processed a stable return must be lodged with the new registered owners.

NOTICES

It has come to the attention of TRNT Stewards that there have been instances at recent race meetings whereby trainers have been using plastic bottles and assorted types of containers to rinse water through a horse's mouth in the race day stalls prior to racing or applying a tongue tie. From a perception perspective this practise is not permitted and is also a breach of AR251(1) which states:

(1) A person must not, without the written permission of the Stewards, have in his or her possession:

(a) on a racecourse where a race meeting is being conducted; or

(b) in any motor vehicle, horse float or other mode of transport used for the purpose of transporting a horse/s to and/or from a race meeting, any prohibited substance, or a syringe, needle, naso-gastric tube or other instrument that could be used:

(i) to administer a prohibited substance to a horse; or
(ii) to produce a prohibited substance in a horse.

TRNT Stewards place all NT trainers and visiting trainers on notice that this practice is not permitted and the only approved method to wash out a horse's mouth prior to competing in a race is with the use of running water from a hose.

ALTRENOGEST WARNING

Thoroughbred Racing Northern Territory (TRNT) has been made aware that Racing Victoria published a warning on 19th June 2018 regarding veterinary prescription animal remedies containing the progestagen altrenogest, used to control the cyclic activity of fillies and mares.

It has been recently discovered that certain batches of altrenogest products may contain levels of trenbolone and/or trendione.

Racing Victoria advised that they are liaising with manufacturers to clarify the situation and that they will provide results of their work in this regard.

RVL advises trainers (and their veterinarians) to immediately stop the use of products that contain altrenogest.

Racing NSW also published that it is aware of the Racing Victoria warning and has released that similarly it has been recently discovered that certain batches of altrenogest products may contain low level traces of trenbolone and/or trendione. Racing NSW is conducting its own investigations into this matter.

Until the situation is clarified, NSW trainers and veterinarians should avoid using injectable products containing altrenogest, and as a precaution, should not administer oral altrenogest products within one clear day prior to racing.

TRNT encourages all NT and Visiting trainers to take heed of these warnings and the advice given by RVL and Racing NSW.

TROBIS

TERRITORY RACEHORSE OWNERS BONUS INCENTIVE SCHEME

Private purchasers nomination fee \$1200

Horses sold through Alice Springs Turf Club or Darwin Turf Club \$900.

Early nomination fee \$300 for the progeny of Northern Territory broodmares

The definition of a Northern Territory broodmare is: "A broodmare which, at the time of foaling, has as a minimum 50 per cent Northern Territory residents as owners.

All early nominations for progeny of NT Broodmares must be received and the appropriate fees paid by 31 July in the season after the horse to be nominated was foaled (prior to the horse turning 2YO).



BONUS 1 \$4000

to be paid to the winner if TROBIS qualified or 50% (\$2000) to the first horse past the post in second to fifth place.

BONUS 2 \$1000

to be paid to the second TROBIS qualified horse past the post in second to fifth place.

Any nomination for TROBIS must be made prior to the horse turning four years of age. Horses bought through the Darwin Magic Millions Tried Horse Sale that turn four on 1 August, nomination fees must be paid before 31 August of that year, or prior to acceptances for the horse's first run in the NT, whichever comes first. will be forfeited.

All TROBIS races are identified in the racing program.

Horses not qualified for TROBIS may run in TROBIS bonus races, but are ineligible to receive bonuses.

TROBIS nomination forms are available from the offices of Thoroughbred Racing NT.

To be eligible for nomination, horses must have a minimum of 25 per cent Northern Territory ownership or lease holding.

Horses nominated for TROBIS will be eligible to win advertised bonuses whilst they are two, three and four years old.

CONDITIONS

Any nomination may, at the discretion of the TROBIS Executive Committee, be rejected without assigning any reason.

Notwithstanding the above, the TROBIS nomination for any horse must be received and the correct fee paid no later than 24 hours prior to acceptances for its first race start in the Northern Territory.

Should a dead heat occur in a TROBIS race, the bonus will be shared equally between such horses.

The TROBIS nominator's payment will be made to the current owner (manager) as per the Australian Register of Racehorses or registered lease document.

Should a nominator (owner or vendor) supply incorrect information on the TROBIS nomination form, the nomination will be null and void and all fees paid will be forfeited.





BENCHMARK RACES

AVERAGE BENCHMARK

Average Benchmark Races (ABR) are races where the benchmark level is set after nominations are taken.

HOW ABR RACES WORK

- Entries are taken as per normal.
- The average rating of those horses entered is then calculated (see conditions).
- The average rating then becomes the benchmark for that race.
- The Benchmark (rating) for the race is then allocated 58kg's and all other horses are weighted up or down according to the template.

Conditions

- To ensure that the Benchmark is not skewed either by a particularly high or low rated horse the top and bottom rated 10% of horses entered, or in cases where there are less than ten entries the highest and lowest rated horses are discounted for the purpose of calculating the average. The remaining horses ratings are then averaged to create the benchmark for that race.
- Any horse which runs in the first three in an ABR and is rated below the 55.0kg minimum will automatically be rerated up to the 55.0kg of that race.
- If the stewards believe that any horse/s may have been nominated in an endeavor to affect the Benchmark in an ABR race they may instruct the handicapper to discount its rating in the calculation of the Benchmark for that race. Stewards will scrutinize the nominations and exclude any horses from the calculation of the average benchmark if they believe that such horse/s sits outside the norm for that race. All horses which are used for the average calculation will be identified on the weights.

Amended Benchmark 54 races — November 1, 2020

54 rated horses to carry the equivalent of 59kg. Each rating point above 54 will incur a penalty of 0.5kg, i.e. a 60 rater (6pts above 54) will receive 62kg. Similarly, each horse's rating below 54 will reduce the weight carried by 0.5kg down to a minimum of 55kg.

Trainers will be permitted to enter horses rated above 54 but no horse with a rating above 60 will be eligible.

The travel subsidy will be paid to the trainer of each horse that starts at the respective country fixtures.

RATINGS - BANDED RACES AND BUSINESS RULES

1. All horses intending to run in a Ratings banded race in the Northern Territory must have a rating formalized by the official handicapping panel assigned to the Northern Territory (TRSA Handicapping Panel) prior to nomination closing time.
2. Only ratings issued by the TRSA handicapping panel for the Northern Territory will be recognized.
3. Horses domiciled in the Northern Territory competing in other states will need to be re-rated on return to the Northern Territory. It cannot be assumed the interstate ratings will be directly correlated to the Northern Territory template rating or other templates.
4. Horses will be eligible to nominate for races which have a rating qualification, if at the time of nomination they qualify in the specified Rating Band. Horses eligible at nomination time shall be permitted to compete regardless of any subsequent rating by virtue of re-handicap in that race even if that rating exceeds or drops below the top or bottom rating band in that race.
5. Horses shall receive a handicap in a race according to their rating at close of Nomination time in line with the NT RBH template. Provided that any horse racing between the time of close of nominations and declaration of weight time may be re-rated by the handicapper in accordance with performances in this period.
6. Fillies and Mares allowed a 2.0kg sex allowance. 2 & 3yo's allowed an allowance the same as the **maiden scale**.

7. Set weight maiden scale is as follows:

August-November

4yo and up geldings and entires - 59.0kg;
 4yo and up mares - 57.0kg;
 3yo colts and geldings - 56.5kg;
 3yo fillies - 54.5kg.

December-March

4yo and up geldings and entires - 59.0kg;
 4yo and up mares - 57.0kg;
 3yo colts and geldings - 57.5kg;
 3yo fillies - 55.5kg;
 2yo colts and geldings - 56.5kg;
 2yo fillies - 54.5kg.

April-July

4yo and up geldings and entires - 59.0kg;
 4yo and up mares - 57.0kg;
 3yo colts and geldings - 58.5kg;
 3yo fillies - 56.5kg;
 2yo colts and geldings - 57.5kg;
 2yo fillies - 55.5kg.

8. All races are subject to AR167 and any rules that pertain to minimum and maximum weights, (notwithstanding re handicapped horses, see point 4).
9. A horse running in a higher class event, than which they are eligible, may not automatically decrease in rating for an unplaced performance.

10. A horse running in a higher class event than which they are eligible and winning will be rated from the minimum weight, not their pre-race rating.

11. An open class horse will be eligible to run in a 0-58 or BM 54 Rating race. (effective 1.11.20)

12. Should a horse win by six lengths or more, it is liable for an additional rating point over and above the penalty scale guide at 13. (below)

13. The Handicapper will use as a guide the following penalty scale:

FIELD SIZE	1ST	2ND	3RD
6 horses or less	+1.5kg	level	-0.5kg
7 horses or more	+2.0kg	+0.5kg	level

14. Any horse racing at the top of a Ratings Band (0-58, 0-62, 0-64, 0-66, 0-70, 0-76) for which it is eligible and runs a place will not be re-rated to push it out of that Band, however, if a horse is running in a higher Band and runs a place it may be re-rated out of a Band depending on performance. **NB:** Clause 14 does not apply to Benchmark 54 races.

15. A maiden horse which wins a race in the NT will be rated as follows: a set weights maiden winner – 56; the winner of a 0-64 ratings race and below, or a Class 2 – between 56 and 58; the winner of any other race – at the discretion of the Handicapper.

16. All maiden horses shall receive an interim rating by the handicapper to allocate a weight and to establish a ballot order.

17. All unraced horses nominated for their first start will receive a rating of 54.

18. Apprentices will be permitted to claim in maiden races.

19. Winning horses will receive a maximum points increase of eight (8) for winning out of their grade – this will only apply to races with total stakemoney less than \$30,000, and will not apply to maidens.

NT REGULATIONS APPLYING TO THE USE OF GEAR

Trainers responsible for condition of gear: Trainers shall be held responsible for seeing that all racing gear provided by them is approved for use and is in proper condition.

To be fitted before entering mounting yard:

all gear to be used on a horse shall be fitted before it enters the mounting yard.

Bandages:

(1) Standard bandages are approved for the purposes of AR.206(1), but must be stitched the full length on the outside of the leg in contrasting thread.

(2) Self adhesive bandages (eg Coflex, Vetrap) are approved for the purposes of AR.206(1), maybe stitched, or electrical tape applied at least two times around the circumference of the bandage.

(3) Adhesive bandages (eg Elastoplast) are approved for the purposes of AR.206(1), but must be stitched with contrasting thread.

Bits

are to be categorised in one of the following five ways:

Lugging Bit

Norton Bit

Tongue Control

Butterfly Bit

Standard Bit

Bit Lifter: the following are permitted for use as bit lifters:

(i) elastic strap attached to the bridle and down the nasal bone to the bit with a single strap;

(ii) kyneton nose band.

Blinkers

may only be used in a race if they are of a pattern and design approved by the Stewards. Blinkers must be worn under the bridle.

Open Cup Blinkers, Closed Cup Blinkers and One Eyed Blinkers will be approved if:

(i) application for use has been made and an amended stable return has been lodged;

(ii) approval has been granted for their use by the Stewards. Permission to discontinue the use of blinkers on a horse must be obtained from the Stewards and an amended stable return lodged.

Closed Cup Blinkers will be approved if:

Application has been made and approval granted by the Stewards.

Application for the discontinued use must be made and approval granted by the Stewards.

Closed Cup Blinkers must not cover more than 50% of the eye piece.

Horses fitted with Closed Cup Blinkers must have full forward and peripheral view, to the satisfaction of the Stewards.

Any horse which is presented with Closed Cup Blinkers and in the opinion of the Stewards such horse does not have full

forward and peripheral vision the Closed Cup Blinkers will be removed and an announcement will be made to that effect.

Visor:

blinker cup with no more than 50% width of cup removed.

Winkers:

lamb's wool rolls which are attached to the cheek strap of the bridle are permitted. They must not exceed 270mm in length and no more than 50mm in diameter.

Pacifiers:

(i) must be strong mesh that will resume normal shape after compression;

(ii) must be worn under the bridle.

Boots:

must be of a design approved by the Stewards. They must be of good quality and light design. Boots must be secured with buckles or velcro which must be taped with electrical tape, not with interlocking material or press studs.

Boots may be used over self adhesive or adhesive bandages but not over the top of other bandages.

Bubble Cheeker:

circular rubber or leather burr. Burr must be shaped so as not to damage skin.

Cheekers:

consisting of a rubber strap attached to the bridle and down the nasal bone to the bit, may be approved. The circular type may be attached to the bit in rubber or leather with a smooth, soft face.

Cornell Collar:

may only be used in a race if:

(i) a letter from a veterinarian stating that the use of the Cornell Collar is justified and appropriate for that horse;

(ii) the horse must trial in the Cornell Collar to the satisfaction of the stewards;

(iii) only the original Vet-Aire Cornell Collar may be used.

Cross-over noseband

must be leather or PVC fabric.

Earmuffs:

are permitted but:

(i) must be of a design and made of a material approved by the Stewards;

(ii) will be approved for horses which are troublesome in some way;

(iii) trainers requesting earmuffs will be required to show that the horse is sufficiently wayward to warrant their use.

Please be advised that as from 1st March 2018, all trainers are responsible for providing your own set of RED Ear Muffs for any horse requiring this piece of gear to be worn for parade and preliminary purposes only. The Ear Muffs are to be fitted over the bridle which will alert race day officials that they are to be removed at the barriers prior to the race.

Trainers intending to use Ear Muffs for this purpose are required to submit a gear change request with Racing Australia as is the current practice

All applications for the use of or removal of any gear must be made prior to the closing of acceptances and applications made on the morning of the day of acceptances must also be notified to the TRNT Stewards

Darwin Turf Club

Trainers are responsible for ensuring their staff (stable employees) are aware of and comply with these regulations.

These new procedures are in line with OHS requirements as the Darwin Turf Club is committed to providing a safe working environment for Staff and Industry participants.

Alice Springs Turf Club

Regulations governing the use of the Club's racecourse and training track

The Alice Springs Turf Club has issued a revised set of Track Regulations that are effective from July 2017. A copy of the regulations can be downloaded via the Alice Springs Turf Club's website or alternatively a copy can be provided by contacting the Alice Springs Turf Club office or Thoroughbred Racing Northern Territory Stewards.

All trainers, jockeys and track riders must read a copy of the Track Regulations and prior to using the facilities for the first time, complete an induction with an Alice Springs Turf Club nominated official. Upon completion of this induction the individual must sign an acknowledgment declaration which will be kept on file with the Alice Springs Turf Club. Trainers are responsible for ensuring their staff (stable employees) are aware of and comply with these regulations.

These new procedures are in line with OHS requirements as the Alice Springs Turf Club is committed to providing a safe working environment for Staff and Industry participants.

Northern Territory Barrier Trials

Barrier Trials to be conducted:

Darwin – Tuesday morning as requested.

Alice Springs – On race day following the completion of the final event or on Tuesday morning (or another time) by arrangement with the stewards.

The Trial fee is \$55.00 (inclusive of GST). Riders receive \$25 per ride (plus GST if applicable and super) while the nomination fee for entering for the barrier trials is \$30.

Entries:

Darwin - 12:00am Friday for trials on Tuesday.

Alice Springs – 9:30am Thursday for race day, 11:00am Monday for Tuesday.

Trials will be conducted over:

Darwin – 900m

Alice Springs – 800m or such other distance if required.

Minimum of four (4) runners are required for a trial to proceed except in special circumstances as approved by the Stewards.

Horses trialing for the purpose of gaining a barrier certificate or to be reinstated following an embargo must:

- Load in a reasonable time
- Must not be reversed into the barrier
- Must not be placed into the barrier with front gate open
- Must not be fractious or unruly whilst in the barriers
- Must jump away in a reasonable manner
- Perform tractably after jumping away
- Horses trialing for the purpose of obtaining an initial barrier certificate cannot be loaded riderless

The use of approved barrier aids may be used if the starter deems necessary to help load a horse in a timely and safe manner.

If an approved barrier aid is used to assist a horse to load, the trainer must then without delay advise the Stewards and have that gear added for race day.

For barrier trials conducted outside race day, trainers must provide appropriate licensed staff at the barriers to load their horses into the gates. These staff must wear appropriate footwear and an approved helmet and vest.

Northern Territory Starters Subsidy

A subsidy is paid to all horses which race and do not earn prize money. The payment will be paid to the trainer of each horse. However the managing owner can elect to have the subsidy paid to the managing owner. To do so the managing owner must complete the appropriate notification form and lodge it with the TRNT.

The subsidy is as follows: Darwin and Top End country clubs post Melbourne Cup Day-end of March, \$800; April-Melbourne Cup Day, \$550; Alice Springs and Tennant Creek post Alice Springs Cup Day-end of September, \$800; October-Alice Springs Cup Day, \$550

Facilities Fee

As of the 1st May 2016 the facilities fee for horses running in the Top End region is \$ 286.00 inc GST

As of 1st April 2016 the facilities fee for horses running in the Central region is \$165.00 inc GST.

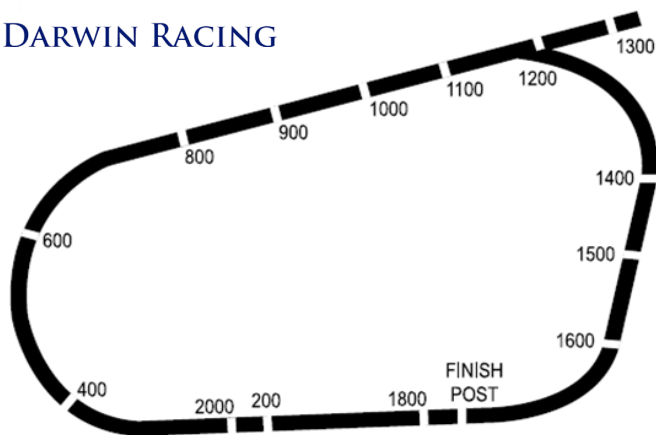
